

2018 National Curriculum Test Analysis Tools Some Helpful Release Notes (June 2018)

Thank-you for using our Test Analysis Tools. Over 1500 were downloaded in the last 12 months.

Changes for 2018 versions:

- General:
 - For maths, we have combined the arithmetic and reasoning analysis into one tool
 - Reading and writing versions remain free
 - o All versions can accommodate up to 500 pupils.
- Data Input Tab
 - You can now filter under the questions. This is helpful for performing a gap analysis, but it also helps when printing. Remove blanks and you will just print what you need
 - Some minor fixes to help when trying to delete a pupil.
- Pupil Summary
 - You can filter here too for the same reasons mentioned above
 - Some of the conditional formatting has been removed in the 'overall' section as it was unnecessary
 - Don't forget you can adjust the percentage bands for the colour coding at the top of the screen, you may have to switch to another sheet before you see it happen. Percentages have been set in line with the scaled scores.
- Pupil Report
 - Due to requests, we have added a lot more detail under the charts. You can see how a pupil has performed against each question – useful for gap analysis and sharing with pupils/parents
 - For KS2, you can compare the performance of a child to national performance in an assessment area. These benchmarks are editable in the 'Cohort' tab (see below)
 - You can switch off the 'Standard' heading if you feel it is not helpful.
- Cohort Summary
 - Some minor amendments to the charts
 - For KS2 we have added national comparison for each assessment area in the bar chart
 - the pie chart replaces the ring chart in top right corner
 - For KS2 you can amend the national benchmark percentages. This is useful if you purchased the tool before the national data has been released. If you bought the item before the release of 2018 ASP, then the percentages are from 2017.
