	DNA: other sentence types e.g.: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Will the flower grow? Grow the flower, Will!
	AG: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Correct punctuation refers to correct use of sentence demarcation in the sentence – other incorrect or omitted punctuation should not be penalised. Incorrect spelling should not be penalised, unless a misspelling creates a grammatically incorrect sentence, e.g. The flower will grows. Attempts to punctuate the whole sentence as direct speech should not be penalised.
