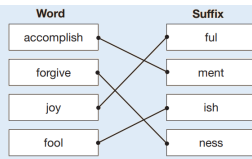

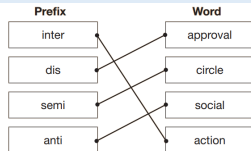

Correctly placed dash:
