AG Also award 1 mark for a grammatically correct question with the word 'far' omitted with incorrect punctuation, e.g.

• can bees fly?

• Can bees fly.

DNA other sentence types, e.g. Bees can fly far.

AG Correct punctuation refers to correct capitalisation throughout the sentence and an end question mark - other additional incorrect punctuation should not be penalised.

AG Incorrect spelling should not be penalised, unless a misspelling creates a grammatically incorrect sentence, e.g. Can bee fly far?

AG Attempts to punctuate the whole sentence as direct speech should not be penalised.
