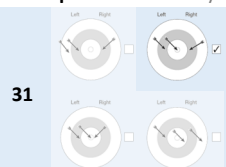

 2. the crowd concentrating on Merry
 3. the crowd watching Merry's arrow
- AA reference to allowing Merry to concentrate / focus
AA reference to the crowd's disbelief at Merry being a child / girl in a predominantly adult / male event
DNA reference to generic feelings without elaboration

Either of the following:

Any of the following:

1. the audience being able to better appreciate the archers' skills
2. making it more challenging for the archers
3. increasing the crowd's enjoyment / interest

DNA reference to an acceptable point without the increased benefit for the audience / increased challenge for the archers

Any of the following:

1. the tension in the bow
2. Merry drawing back her bow to its fullest extension
3. Merry fearing the bow had been overstretched

AA reference to the quotation, 'She needed all its power now to make the extra distance and to maintain accuracy'
DNA reference to Merry's power in pulling the bow back
